Apple Trees

Mutsu Apple



Larger than Yellow Delicious. This apple is both spicy and juicy. It is almost perfectly round and probably the most yellow of all apples. Ripens in late September. Pollinate with any other variety. It is excellent for fresh eating, sauces, pies, and baking. This apple stores and keeps well. Shipped at 2 to 4 feet.

Grimes Golden Apple



The tree is hardy, grows upright and is quite disease resistant. Medium to large, bright yellow, flesh fine grained, juicy, with a very pleasing spicy flavor. Highly recommended and widely planted to pollinate self sterile varieties. Pollinate with any other variety. Shipped at 2 to 4 feet.

HoneyCrisp Apple



A quick-bearing apple that will ripen in September. Has large fruit- stays crisp for 3 months- Hence its name. Pollinate with any other variety. Shipped at 2 to 4 feet.

Cherry Trees

Montmorency Cherry Trees (Sour)

Standard and Dwarf



Universally recognized the best sour Cherry for eating fresh, canning, baking and preserving. Bears large fruit very young. America's favorite hi-yielding cherry. Self-pollinating. Shipped at 2 to 4 feet.

Wildroot Horseradish

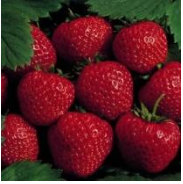


This variety has more punch than other varieties. Nice tangy flavor. A perennial plant harvested in fall or spring.



Strawberries

Allstar Strawberries



Bears in late midseason and produces berries actually as large as plums! **Frost resistant.** Excellent flavor with fruit that's big, firm, sweet, extra juicy and red. Bears in June.

Lateglow Strawberries



Berries are very large and firm. Great juicy sweet flavor with an outstanding aroma. Plants are vigorous and show excellent resistance to root problems. Lateglow blooms late with Allstar but ripens after them.

Blackberries

Apache (Thornless)



Fruiting season is mid to late June in zone 6. Fruit of Apache is large. No disease problems have been found. It has an excellent fruit quality, glossy black conical shape fruit. Winter hardy.

Navaho (Thornless)



Glossy black berries, sweeter and firmer than previous thornless varieties, with smaller seed size. Also very winter hardy. This Patented variety requires little maintenance. No wires or trellis needed. Ripens early to mid June.

Raspberries

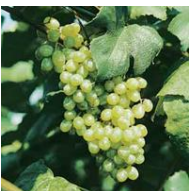
NOVA Red Raspberry



Early ripening type. Noted for its winter hardiness. But it is also very disease resistant. Medium large berries. Good flavor and production. It tolerates temperature changes very well.

Grapes

Niagara White Seeded Grape



Sweet white grape. Prized for its juice, or fresh table use. An excellent producer. Very winter hardy, ripens about one week before Concord. Late August in Zone 6.

Blueberries



RABBITEYE TYPE

Brightwell Early to mid-season ripening, medium-large berry, has sweet flavor and light blue color. Growth is upright and vigorous. A consistent producer.

Climax Early ripening, produces medium-size berries with sweet flavor. Plants are upright with intense green foliage. One of the very best for harvesting.

Onslow Self fertile, mid-late season, vigorous, semi-upright large fruit.

Powder Blue Late-season ripening, highly productive with medium to large sweet fruit, darker in color. Upright plant with good foliage.

Premier Early to mid-season, large fruit. Excellent flavor, light blue in color and good quality. Plants are upright with good foliage. Highly productive.

SOUTHERN Highbush TYPE

Blue Ridge Early mid-season. Large fruit, firm, light blue color. Bushes very vigorous, upright and productive.

NORTHERN Highbush TYPE

Blue Crop Early mid-season. Large, firm berry, good flavor. Loose fruit cluster. Upright, vigorous, productive bush. Hardy, drought resistant.

Elliott Late season. Small to medium, firm, light blue fruit. Good ornamental, upright growth.

Jersey Late. Medium to large berry, firm, good taste. Long loose clusters. Hardy, productive, upright, vigorous, fast-growing ornamental.
