## Strawberries

	Quantity	Total Cost
<b>Allstar</b> ~ Bears in late midseason and produces berries actually as large as plums! Frost resistant. Excellent flavor with fruit that's big, firm, sweet, extra juicy and red. Bears in June.		
<b>Lateglow</b> ~ Berries are very large and firm. Great juicy sweet flavor with an outstanding aroma. Plants are vigorous and show excellent resistance to root problems. Lateglow blooms late with Allstar but ripens after them.

## Blackberries

₹5 per plant or 3 for ₹12

	Quantity	Total Cost
<b>Apache (Thornless)</b> ~ Fruiting season is mid to late June in zone 6. Fruit of Apache is large. No disease problems have been found. It has an excellent fruit quality, glossy black conical shape fruit. Winter hardy.		
<b>Navaho (Thornless)</b> ~ Glossy black berries, sweeter and firmer than previous thornless varieties, with smaller seed size. Also very winter hardy. This Patented variety requires little maintenance. No wires or trellis needed. Ripens early to mid June.		
<b>Triple Crown (Thornless)</b> ~ This variety is a semi-erect type plant, bears very heavy, large fruit with excellent flavor. Is winter hardy and makes a very sturdy cane system. Winds do not affect this variety as bad as others, canes do not break at base, like some types do. Triple Crown would be a good choice to help extend the blackberry season for home gardeners.

<b>Wildroot Horseradish</b> ~ This variety has more punch than other varieties. Nice tangy flavor. A perennial plant harvested in fall or spring.

## Raspberries

	Quantity	Total Cost
<b>NOVA Red Raspberry</b> ~ Early ripening type. Noted for its winter hardiness. But it is also very disease resistant. Medium large berries. Good flavor and production. It tolerates temperature changes very well.		
<b>Fall Gold Everbearing Yellow Raspberry</b> ~ This everbearing yellow-gold raspberry is extremely sweet and excellent for fresh eating, canning and preserves. Similar to red raspberries. They are vigorous and extremely hardy.

## Grapes

	Quantity	Total Cost
<b>Concord</b> ~ Resembles the Concord but has no seeds. Medium size grapes, good for pies.		
<b>Himrod</b> ~ Excellent white seedless grape. Large and sweet yellow flesh. Delicious flavor and very winter hardy.		
<b>Reliance</b> ~ A pink, seedless table grape with very high dessert quality. Berries are medium in size that grow in medium to large clusters. Hardy vines are very productive and vigorous. Blooms late and is disease resistant. Great for jelly and juicing.		
<b>Vanessa</b> ~ Early ripening red seedless grape. Very fruity, sweet taste. Medium to large size fruit. Does not crack in wet conditions. Very disease resistant and extremely winter hardy.

## Blueberries

When planting blueberries, it is recommended to plant at least 2 varieties to ensure cross-pollination.

	Quantity	Total Cost
<b>Brightwell</b> ~ Early to mid-season ripening, medium-large berry, has sweet flavor and light blue color. Growth is upright and vigorous. A consistent producer.		
<b>Climax</b> ~ Early ripening, produces medium-size berries with sweet flavor. Plants are upright with intense green foliage. One of the very best for harvesting.		
<b>Columbus</b> ~ Early to mid-season ripening, has excellent size berries with good color. Yields are good; needs a pollinator.		
<b>Powder Blue</b> ~ Late-season ripening, highly productive with medium to large sweet fruit, darker in color. Upright plant with good foliage.		
<b>Premier</b> ~ Early to mid-season, large fruit. Excellent flavor, light blue in color and good quality. Plants are upright with good foliage. Highly productive.		
<b>Tifblue</b> ~ Mid-season ripening, produces medium to large berries with good color. Plants are semi-upright with moderately vigorous growth. *Self-fertile*

# Herbs

	Quantity	Total Cost
<b>Basil</b> ~ Sweet, peppery flavor, aromatic. Uses: chicken, eggs, fish, pasta, pesto, tomatoes, Italian and Mediterranean recipes		
<b>Bay</b> ~ Earthy, pungent aroma. Uses: Meats, pickling, sauces, soups, garam masala, stews, vegetables		
<b>Catnip</b> ~ Use in teas; fragrance for cats.		
<b>Chives</b> ~ Source of vitamin A. Onion or garlic flavor. Uses: Appetizers, cream soups, fish, salads, egg and cheese dishes, sauces		
<b>Cilantro</b> ~ Pungent, soapy fragrance. Uses: Fish, rice, salsas, salads, and Italian, Latin American and Mexican recipes		
<b>Dill</b> ~ Pungent, tangy. Uses: Breads, fish, pickling, salads, sauces, vegetables		
<b>Garlic</b> ~ widely used for its pungent flavor as a seasoning or condiment		
<b>Lemon Balm</b> ~ Mint-like leaves, also called balm. Sweet, lemon flavor with a citrus scent. Uses: Jams and jellies, salads, soups, teas		
<b>Lemon Verbena</b> ~ Use in potpourris; herb pillows; lemon flavoring for drinks, salads, and jellies; teas.		
<b>Mosquito Plant (Citronella)</b> ~ used in alternative herbal treatment and as an insect repellent		
<b>Mint (Chocolate)</b> ~ Leaves smell and taste like mint and chocolate. Used like any mint plant in drinks, salads, desserts, sauces or as a garnish.		
<b>Mint (Curly)</b> ~ Used in drinks, salads, desserts, sauces or as a garnish. Attractive to butterflies; fragrant		
<b>Mint (Peppermint)</b> ~ Used in drinks, salads, desserts, sauces or as a garnish. Attractive to butterflies; fragrant		
<b>Oregano</b> ~ Strong, aromatic with a pungent "pizza" flavor. Uses: Fish, meat, poultry, tomato sauces; Greek, Italian and Mexican recipes		
<b>Parsley</b> ~ Delicate, slightly peppery taste. Uses: Sprigs used as garnish, herb mixtures, sauces, soups, stews. Wide variety of uses.		
<b>Rosemary</b> ~ Sweet, hint of lemon and pine. Uses: Casseroles, fish, fruit salads, lamb, chicken, soups, stuffings, tomato sauce		
<b>Sage</b> ~ Musty, minty, slightly bitter, "sausage" flavor. Uses: Chicken, duck, goose, pork, sausages, stuffings		
<b>Tarragon</b> ~ Mild licorice flavor. Uses: Eggs, meats, pickling, poultry, salads, sauces, dressings, blend		
<b>Thyme</b> ~ Very aromatic, minty, tea-like. Uses: Fish, meats, poultry, soups, stocks, vegetables (eggplants, mushrooms, potatoes and summer squash)
