**Arkansas Black:** Dark red-purple apples: Sharp flavor has a sweet aftertaste; Harvest in November; Needs a pollination partner of a different variety nearby

**Fuji:** One of the sweetest apple varieties. Round, medium to large in size, is usually green or yellow-green, with red highlights or a pink flush. It may have a speckled or striped pattern . A favorite for fresh eating; also makes a delicious cider. Ripens late September and October. Pollinator required.

**Gala:** Delectably sweet-tart, good for fresh-eating apple and cooking; stores well. Ripens in early October. Partially self-fertile, but a nearby pollination partner of a different variety is beneficial.

**Stayman Winesap:** Dessert apple. large, firm, wine-spicy fruit with a deep red color. Stores well. Cold-hardy. Ripens in mid-October. Needs two pollination partners nearby which must both be of *different* varieties or a single self-fertile pollination partner

**Yellow Delicious:** Sweet and juicy with a hint of spice; highly productive. One of the most dependable pollinators for other varieties. Ripens in late September. Self-pollinating.

**Moonglow:** Big, bold, blushed fruit. Bartlett-type pear is soft and juicy without being mushy. Disease-resistant to fire blight and will bear fruit for years. A strong pollinator for other pear varieties. Harvest in September

**Ayers:** Yellow pear with a red blush. Old southern favorite with a smooth, sweet and melting flesh. Self-pollinating, but production will increase with other varieties planted nearby. Can be picked and allowed to ripen off the tree for several days before eating. Very high sugar content. High resistance to fire blight.

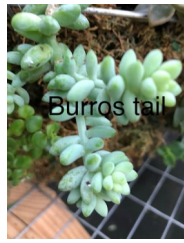

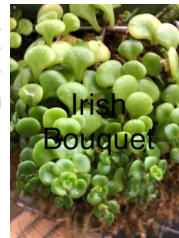

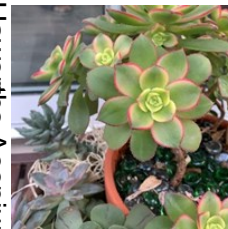
